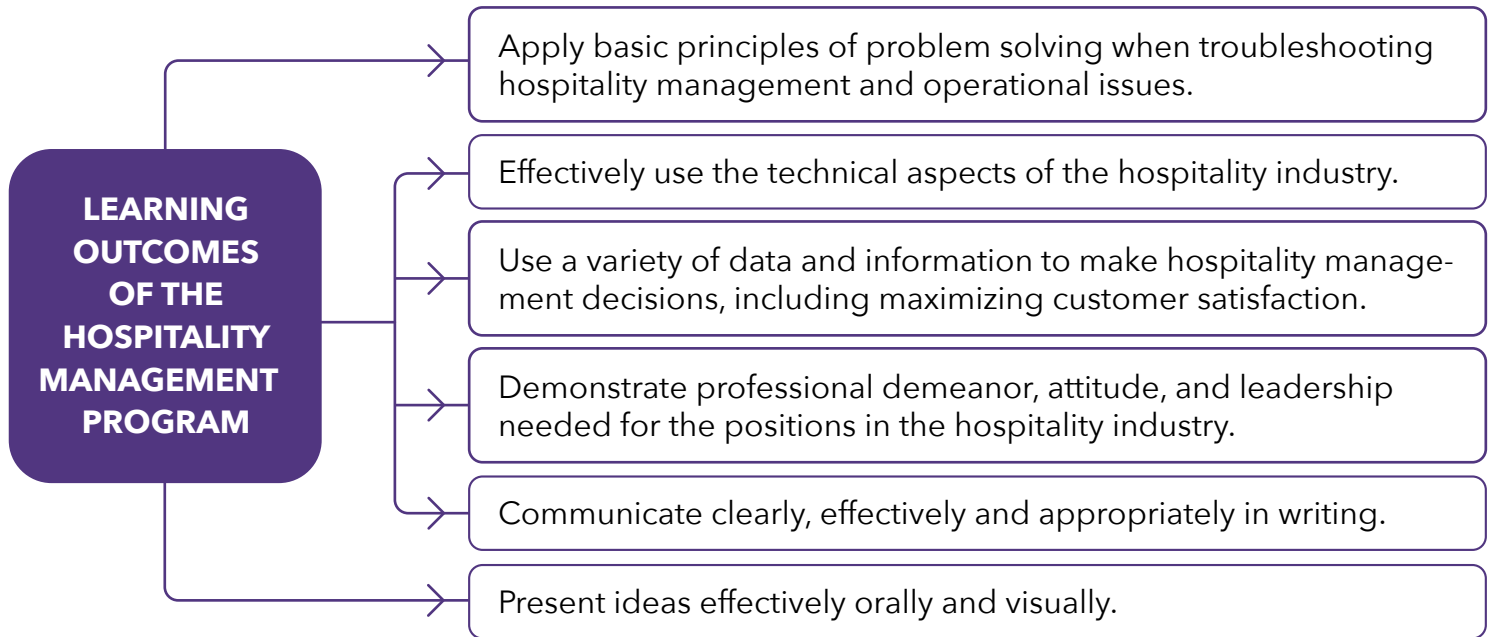




# HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT
